

Harmony Gold constructed the original 85 Robotech episodes from animated footage produced by Tatsunoko Productions, the reknowned animation studio that produced anime classics such as Speed Racer and Battle of the Planets. The resulting epic fueled the transforming robot craze alongside Hasbro's Transformers and was a huge success in over 140 countries, many of which continue to air the original series on television.

At the core of Robotech mythos is a richly detailed saga covering several generations of endearing characters driven to persevere under extraordinary circumstances. The storyline is intricately woven into a setting of lavish, yet functional, production design based in the near future.


